Building Exterior/Interior

Sod installation is complete and is being watered regularly. Triage construction began on or around 10/23 and is progressing nicely. Except for the first 2 or 3 days of saw and hammer action there has been minimal disturbance. No elevator updates.

Strategic Plan

Leadership and staff development: Amy Brooke provided the Myers-Briggs Type Indicator personality inventory training to administrative staff and the coordinator group. This process is assisting our management team with strengthening individualized leadership skills. Learning more about ourselves and others also aligns with the process of becoming a Trauma Informed Care workplace. Several documents for Trauma-Informed Care Workplace policy and guidelines are in draft form.

Convene and Collaborate: The dental supervisor has been engaged in conversation with the Mclean County Dental Society President regarding innovative ways to replace Dr. Jerome Mitchel who has verbally expressed his desire to retire in the upcoming months.

Communication Specialist collaboration is working well. Dion is currently working on several videos for MCHD's YouTube channel. Current topic is seasonal Flu. Videos will be shared with BOH once in final draft.

CHNA partners have begun collaborative efforts toward CHIP. Updates will be provided as we receive them.

Assure Strong Business Practices: Seasonal Flu clinics are going well according to staff. An obvious improvement in morale is contributed to a less stressful flu clinic schedule and improved procedures.

Accounting personnel and dental staff have started a detailed search into Medicaid payment rejection explanations and have begun conversations on how to avoid rejections.

The 2020 budget was presented and approved by the Health Committee on September 30th. There were very few questions from the committee who seemed pleased with the overall results.
