



McLean County Health Department COVID-19 Update May 1st, 2020

- Total Cases: 52,918 (as of 4/30/2020)
- Total deaths: 2,355 (as of 4/30/2020)

McLean County Health Department (MCHD) Activities

- MCHD will be educating McLean County residents through social media regarding maintaining social distance and non-pharmaceutical interventions prior to recovery (re-opening).
- MCHD has provided a digital communication package to community leaders to increase communication to populations disproportionately impacted by COVID-19.
- MCHD has conducted surveys through community leaders to ensure appropriate messaging per population.
- MCHD is monitoring cases of COVID-19 on populations by gender and race/ethnicity.
 - Gender: Female – 60% (57); Male – 40% (38)
 - Race: White – 51.6% (49); Black – 35.8% (34); Other—6.3% (6)
 - Ethnicity: Non-Hispanic – 91.6% (87); Hispanic – 8.4% (8)
- 88% of the confirmed cases have recovered.
- MCHD Environmental Health has been addressing complaints regarding violation of the governor's executive orders.
 - Approximately 50% of all complaints related to social distancing and non-essential business operations.
 - Approximately 18% of all complaints related to employees not wearing masks or gloves while working.
- MCHD is providing personal protective equipment (masks; gloves; gowns; face shields) to long term care facilities and healthcare providers.
- MCHD is still open with some service modifications. Clients are asked to reschedule appointments for services if sick.
 - All clients are asked to wear a face covering while seeking services.



McLean County Health Department COVID-19 Update

- Communicable Disease staff are tracking positive COVID-19 cases and investigating close contacts to determine need for isolation (COVID-19 positive) or quarantine (suspected to have been exposed to someone who is COVID-19 positive).
- MCHD is working with the McLean County Emergency Management Agency to identify alternate housing facilities for residents who need to be isolated (positive and symptomatic), quarantined (suspected to have been exposed to a person with COVID-19) or who are at increased vulnerability (65 or older or with underlying health conditions) who cannot remain at home.
- MCHD is coordinating response activities through the McLean County Emergency Operations Center.
- MCHD is seeking volunteers for the MCHD Medical Reserve Corps.

- MCHD is promoting key messages to the public to practice non-pharmaceutical interventions, to only access medical services if experiencing severe symptoms and to follow the Shelter-In-Place Executive Order.

Expectations for the Community

- Wear face covering in public when social distancing (at least 6 feet from other people) cannot be maintained.
 - Instructions to make face covering can be found at <https://health.mcleancountyil.gov/739/COVID-19-DIY-Face-Mask>
- All residents who fit testing criteria should seek testing at the Community-Based Testing Site located at the Interstate Center (1106 Interstate Drive, Bloomington).
 - Testing Criteria has changed to include the following
 - Symptomatic - Have COVID-19 symptoms (cough, shortness of breath, fever, chills, repeated shaking with chills, muscle pain)
 - Have a risk factor, such as contact with someone confirmed to have COVID-19 or a compromised immune system or a serious chronic medical condition



McLean County Health Department COVID-19 Update

- Essential Personnel (with or without symptoms)
 - Medical Personnel
 - Work in correctional facilities, such as jails or prisons
 - First Responders
 - Support critical infrastructure, such as workers in grocery stores, pharmacies, restaurants, gas stations, public utilities, factories, childcare and sanitation
- Any resident with symptoms
 - Must be able to follow directions and to complete the self-swab on their own.
 - Minors must be accompanied by an adult.
- The testing site is open 7 days per week from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm. (subject to change)
- Report violations of the governor's executive orders to McLean County law enforcement and the McLean County Health Department environmental health program.
- Assume COVID-19 is in all of our communities and take the necessary precautions to protect yourself.
- Observe the Shelter-In-Place Executive Order and only leave your home if necessary.
- Older people and people with severe chronic conditions should take special precautions because they are at higher risk of developing serious COVID-19 illness.
- Practice non-pharmaceutical interventions recommended by the CDC, including:
 - Practice social distancing. Maintain at least 6 feet from others at all times.
 - Avoid sick people. Stay home when you are sick.
 - Wash hands (soap and water or use hand sanitizer that is at least 60% alcohol)
 - Cover cough and sneezes
 - Disinfect surfaces regularly
- Donation drop-off sites (personal protective equipment and homemade face covering):
 - Bin inside the McLean County Sheriff's Office Lobby
 - Two recycling carts at the back door of the Ecology Action Center (202 W College Ave)
 - Please bag items with name and address.
