New Dates Announced for COVID-19 Vaccine Clinics Cancelled in McLean County Last Week

Bloomington, IL—The McLean County Health Department (MCHD) received its delayed COVID-19 vaccine shipment this morning. Second dose clinics cancelled last week due to winter weather and the weather-related shipping delays have been rescheduled.

- Appointments cancelled on Tuesday, February 16 due to the weather have been rescheduled for Thursday, February 25 at the Grossinger Motors Arena.
- Appointments cancelled on Friday, February 19 due to delayed vaccine shipments have been rescheduled for Tuesday, March 2 at the Grossinger Motors Arena.

Individuals will be rescheduled in *the same time slot* as their original appointment on the new clinic dates. This information has been emailed to all those affected by the appointment changes to the email address used when they originally registered. No further action is needed to *confirm* a rescheduled appointment. The email includes instructions on how to reschedule the appointment should there be a conflict.

COVID-19 vaccine being received for first doses is still very limited at this time. The MCHD will open additional clinics and appointments when vaccine supply allows. Everyone who wants a COVID-19 vaccine will have an opportunity to receive one, but it will take time.

To date, our partners from Carle Bromenn Medical Center have offered nine clinics, delivering 4,013 doses of COVID-19 vaccine to McLean County residents. The MCHD has administered over 6,600 doses of COVID-19 vaccine.
