Wednesday's COVID-19 Vaccine Clinic Cancelled Due to Late Shipment

Bloomington, IL—Due to the delay of a shipment of COVID-19 vaccine, Carle BroMenn Medical Center and the McLean County Health Department (MCHD) have canceled tomorrow's vaccine clinic (Wednesday, March 3) at the Activity and Recreation Center (ARC) in Normal. A reschedule date will be announced as soon as vaccine is received. Individuals will be rescheduled in the same time slot as their original appointment on that rescheduled clinic date.

This clinic is for residents receiving their second dose from Pfizer, which recommends receiving the second dose 21 days after receiving the first dose. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the second dose of the Pfizer vaccine may be administered up to six weeks (42) days after the first dose.

This information has been emailed to all residents affected by the appointment change to the email address provided when they originally registered. Those who registered using our call center will be contacted via our call center. The same group will be emailed or called again once a reschedule date has been established. No further action is needed to *confirm* a

rescheduled appointment. Future emails and calls will include instructions on how to reschedule the appointment should there be a conflict.

To date, our partners from Carle BroMenn Medical Center have offered 11 clinics, delivering 4,858 doses of COVID-19 vaccine to McLean County residents. The MCHD has administered over 8,000 doses of COVID-19 vaccine.
